### OKLAHOMA AND NEBRASKA SUE COLORADO

- ▶ The recent lawsuit filed by Oklahoma and Nebraska against Colorado is probably without merit.
- ▶ What is important is that the USA is learning the hard way about the complexity and problems of recreational marijuana, not only with individuals but on societies and lawmakers throughout the USA.
- ▶ As polls have indicated, support of recreational marijuana is declining in the USA.
- ▶ The crushing of the marijuana stock market probably includes investor concerns regarding the entire industry, specifically recreational.
- ▶ The lawsuit allegations included: overflow spillage of recreational marijuana into their states, monitoring these illegalities in their state laws, costs, and dealing with pot heads who have created 'a gap in the Federal control system'.
- ▶ More so than anything, it is the exporting of recreational marijuana out of Colorado and into Oklahoma and Nebraska that concerns both of these states.
- ▶ Law enforcement officers have had both financial problems and practical difficulty curbing trafficking in their two states. The dollar cost of regulating more pot in these states is a significant concern.
- ▶ As these problems arise, it is clear that recreational marijuana being infused into society is receiving strong resistance. The issue is polarizing society at a regulatory level as well as THC's affects on families, children and the social fabric of the country.
