HOW TO MAKE MONEY IN THE MARIJUANA STOCK MARKET MORE ON SESSIONS AND DOJ MARIJUANA ENFORCEMENT

Each week it becomes more clear that Jeff Sessions will enforce crime and drug laws, taking this nation back to the 1980s.

The Washington Post wrote a very revealing article on DOJ enforcement.

Of particular interest, one of the most anti drug/cannabis personalities who will lead a national crackdown on crime, Stephen Cook, has been tabbed to work with Sessions to enforce crime, drug and especially marijuana penalties. We quote:

"Sessions is also expected to take a harder line on the punishment for using and distributing marijuana, a drug he has long abhorred. His crime task force will review existing marijuana policy, according to a memo he wrote prosecutors last week.

Using or distributing marijuana is illegal under federal law, which classifies it as a Schedule 1 drug, the same category as heroin, and considered more dangerous than cocaine and methamphetamine.

In his effort to resurrect the practices of the drug war, it is still unclear what Sessions will do about the wave of states that have legalized marijuana in recent years.

Eight states and the District of Columbia now permit the recreational use of marijuana, and 28 states and the District have legalized the use of medical marijuana.

But his rhetoric against weed seems to get stronger with each speech. In Richmond, he cast doubt on the use of medical marijuana and said it "has been hyped, maybe too much."

Sessions is out to get pot. Make no mistake about it. And He will do it. He has the muscle to enforce.

The question is not whether, but how the Federal Government will enforce Schedule 1 and marijuana. It is certain to stultify the cannabis industry. We don't know how it will look. We do know that this industry faces the men in black head on.
